

THE ENDRICK TRUST (SC012043)

DISTRIBUTION POLICY

The Endrick Trust is a Scottish Charitable Trust (SC012043) established in 1984 for the purpose of distributing the trust funds, capital and revenue, in such proportions and at such times as the Trustees in their sole discretion shall deem expedient among such charitable institutions in the United Kingdom as the Trustees may select, and/or any charitable cause which the Trustees shall deem particularly worthy of support.

1 Who can apply

Organisations registered with OSCR or with the Charity Commission. The Trustees will consider applications from charities based and working in the Greater Glasgow postcode area with an income of less than £2million per annum. Please note that repeat applications within two years are not likely to be successful.

2 What we will fund

The Trust will support a range of charitable causes under the general themes of:-

- (1) Prevention or relief of poverty;
- (2) Advancement of citizenship or community development; and
- (3) any other purpose that may reasonably be regarded as analogous to any of the preceding purposes.

The Trustees have a preference for applications for project funding with a specific outcome, however will consider applications for core funding. The Trustees reserve the right to consider applications outwith the above categories.

3 What we will not fund

The Trustees will not support applications from individuals, animal charities nor applications from medical research charities, charities based and working outwith the Glasgow postcode area nor applications from charities with an income of more than £2million per annum.

4 Size of distribution

Most distributions awarded have been in the range of £1,000-£5,000. However, applications which are exceptional, innovative or soundly based on need may be awarded a larger amount.

5 How to apply

The Trustees have limited funds at their disposal and therefore cannot support all of the causes for which applications are submitted. To keep down administrative costs, general appeal letters not falling within the scope of the Distribution Policy will be disregarded and all other enquiries will be directed to the Trust's Application Form. Applications will not be acknowledged and only successful applicants will be notified of the Trustees' decisions. The Trustees will meet twice yearly to consider applications and agree distributions.
